Preamble

Periyar University, with its twenty five years of yeoman service to the rural populace, has been rightly named after the great social reformer E. V. Ramasamy, who is respectfully called 'Thanthai Periyar'. The University strives its best to make the dream of Thanthai Periyar come true. Situated in the Salem-Bengaluru highway, NH44, and spread over 38.64ha (95.48 acres). Periyar University caters to the higher education needs of people belonging to four districts namely Salem, Namakkal, Dharmapuri and Krishnagiri of Tamil Nadu. The University serves through 27 Departments, 118 affiliated colleges and a Periyar University Centre for Post Graduate and Research Studies for research students, which are varied in nature. For the lifelong learning and for those unable to pursue studies on regular mode, the University is supported with the Periyar University Centre for Online and Distance Education (PUCODE) that produced lakh of graduates.

The University is accredited by the NAAC A++ Grade with CGPA of 3.61 in Cycle 3 and consistently placed within the top 50 in MHRD NIRF ranking 56 and State Public University ranking 25 among the Government and Government aided universities in India. The University nurtures competitive skills among rural students and continuously strives to address the national concerns on the quality of higher education through teaching, research and extension activities. It is governed by its act, statutes, regulations and rules enacted as Periyar University Act of 1997 by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Tamil Nadu. During the academic year 2024-25, 1,175 students were enrolled in 133 programmes under the guidance of 200 teachers. The University receives its funding from various agencies such as UGC, AICTE, CSIR, DBT, DST, ICMR, DRDO, MoEF&CC, MoES, MoFPI, ICSSR, TNSCST and MHRD to carry out research activities through its Departments. The University Departments have collaborations with many institutes like ONGC, NLC, Green Chem, Virbac, Sibar Institute of Dental Sciences, SAGOSERVE, TANMAG, ICMR and Boston India for internships, trainings, exchange programmes and to conduct problem oriented and resource based research through the Letter of Intent and MoUs. The University established linkages with industries, Government and nongovernmental organizations for proactive extension activities and social upliftment efforts, by adopting nearby villages.

5(2)	5.3.1 Infrastructure for Growth and Development of the University
	A. Infrastructure for Placement and Student Progression

One of the important lacunae in the third cycle of NAAC was in 5th criteria (Student support and progression) where the University scored the lowest. Our long-term visionary goal towards globalization, the University needs to establish the following infrastructure inside the University premises to augment student support.

Hence the university proposes a well-designed world-class infrastructure for Placement and Career Guidance Centre to empower the placement and career development training to the students, scholars and post-doctoral researchers. This Centre will also rope in Alumini and other industrial collaboration for placement and career guidance, which will create a strong alumni network and entrust their fund contribution to the development of the University under Corporate Social Responsibility towards well-trained manpower.

With the objective of expanding operational scope, the existing "Career Guidance and Placements Cell" is proposed to be upgraded to the status of "Directorate of Placements." Also, the University has successfully involved departmental alumni networks not only for placement assistance but also for conducting Alumni Lecture Series and interactive programmes. A comprehensive Gap Analysis has been undertaken to identify areas requiring attention in achieving the University's Mission. Besides, an in-depth SWOC (Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities and Challenges) analysis has been conducted for the Institutional Development Plan, which shall be presented during this Planning Board meeting.

B. Establishment of Printing Division

The university is regularly printing invitations, brochures, newsletters, textbooks, laboratory manuals, foundation course materials, answer booklets etc by spending considerable financial resources. Hence establishment of a "Printing division" with high-tech printing and binding facilities to cater the printing requirements is proposed. The proposed facility will generate a return on investment within 3–4 years and generate considerable revenue for the University along with production of teaching learning resources.

C. Establishment of "Periyar University Digital Intelligence Park

The Industry 4.0 convergence aimed at revolutionizing the way companies manufacture, improve and distribute their products in smart way. A PUDI Park towards digitalisation proposed for establishment with contributions from industries under Corporate Social Responsibility grant targeting Industry 4.0 convergence similar to the Tamil Nadu Smart and Advance Manufacturing (TANSAM) established by the Government of Tamil Nadu.

Periyar University has established the Incubation and Technology Transfer Centre (ITTC) with the approval of the University Syndicate, and it currently functions in the Incubation centre of Periyar University. The ITTC provides services aligned with the proposed Periyar University Digital Intelligence Park, in accordance with the Tamil Nadu Smart and Advanced Manufacturing (TANSAM) initiative established by the Government of Tamil Nadu. Three companies have already been granted permission to participate in Information Technology education, and this engagement shall be further strengthened.

D. Establishment of "e-Sevai Centre"

The Government of India has launched a digital India initiative. Under this initiative, the government is making available all government services online. Citizens can also apply for various schemes online. Many state governments are also adopting this approach. Recently the

Government of Tamil Nadu launched the tnesevai.tn.gov.in Portal. Through this portal citizens of Tamil Nadu can avail the benefit of various services. However, use of such services by the rural people is still a difficult task. Hence, we propose as part of the extension service, e-Sevai Centre in Periyar University to extend the online services to the students and public utilizing the existing facilities of Periyar University.

While Periyar University has established an information centre, the requisite infrastructure for operating an "e-sevai" centre is yet to be provided. Nevertheless, the National Service Scheme (NSS) team of Periyar University actively conducts various community service programmes, including: (1) Voter Registration Camp for facilitating new voter registrations and updating existing Electoral Photo Identity Cards, (2) Aadhaar Enrolment and Updation Camp, (3) Blood Donation Camp, (4) Eye Check-up Camp, and (5) Master Health Check-up Camp, amongst others.

5.3.2 Innovator Research Grant

The university is providing UPDF without specific guidelines and we provide a monthly fellowship of only Rs.15,000/- per month, which is not attracting the required candidates. Besides the guidelines do not permit Periyar University students to advance their research done in our laboratories. Hence, in the place of UPDF we are proposing a new innovator research grant similar to 'Walk with a Scholar' scheme, which is the most successful and prevailing scheme in various universities and higher education institutions at national and international levels. In compliance with that scheme, an innovator research grant in the name of 'Step up to Invent / Walk to Innovate / Innovate to Earn' proposed to be introduced for aspiring researchers who would like to invent a solution for a problem most prevailing in the society or introducing a new concept to the society. A corpus fund of 2 - 5 crores is to proposed to be generated through corporate social responsibility or form philanthropist and the interest accrued will be utilized for providing a monthly fellowship for two years at Rs.25,000/- or more besides a research grant of Rs. Two lakh will be provided for each innovative proposal as processed and provided by EDII-TN under Innovative Voucher Programme. Any aspiring researcher from UG, PG, Ph.D. Scholars from University Department as well as any employ of the university can apply for the scheme either individually or as a team while the University provides a call to submit the proposal and utilise the grant. Initially we have planned to provide

5 proposals in a year spelt with a market-driven radical or incremental innovative solution to a problem.

The Ignition Grant of DST iTBI (Rs.2 to 10 lakh per Innovator/Startup) and Innovation Voucher Programme of EDII-TN (Rs.2 lakh per Innovator/Startup) offered through Periyar University Business Incubation Confederation is meant for Innovators who want to become an Entrepreneur. The university collected an amount of Rs. 10 Lakhs as Silver Jubilee fund and the university sanctioned as grant based on the proposals from professors. Further we are planning to establish a corpus fund in future for this purpose.

5.3.3. IPR Facilitation Centre

Periyar University has established an IPR Cell to generate awareness about the scope and purpose of IPR, types of IPR, mode of making applications etc. In order to increase the number of copyrights, patents and trademarks filed, published and granted to the University, we propose to establish IPR Facilitation Centre with a full-time employee who supports filing patents, copyright and trademark with patent and trademark search under the mentorship of authorised professionals. The facility can be utilised by all innovators, startups, entrepreneurs and business operators who are connected with any department or division or scheme of the University.

The IPR cell functioning already being strengthened and university conducted for workshop and also engages a facilitator for helping on this regard.

5.3.4. Promotion of E-Content Development

As per the score analysis of NIRF ranking under various parameters, University is in urgent need to motivate the faculty, post-doctoral fellow and scholars (both stipend and non-stipend) to develop and upload the validated content in SWAYAM, University LMS and any professionally recognized e-Learning platform like Udemy, Coursera, OpenEdx etc. with the approval of "e-Learning Resource Centre". This activity may be mandated to all faculty and postdoctoral fellows with an intention to create 5 – 10 module-based content per month.

In alignment with the goal to encourage faculty, post doctoral fellows, and scholars to develop and upload validated e-learning content on the University LMS, preliminary steps are being planned to initiate the process. A structured framework will be developed in consultation with the E-Learning Resource Centre to outline guidelines, provide training, and establish a content validation mechanism. Awareness campaigns and workshops will be scheduled to ensure stakeholders understand the significance of this initiative. A monitoring system will also be introduced to track progress and ensure adherence to the target of 5-10 modules per month. The initiative is in its initial stages, with a focus on laying a strong foundation for successful implementation.

5.3.5. NABL Accreditation of Laboratories

Periyar University has established a Centre for Instrumentation and Maintenance Facility (CIMF) and many research laboratories in biological science, life science, food and nutritional science, material science, textile science, geoscience, energy science and so on. Many of the advanced instruments are introduced in the i-Stem portal of the Government of India for public use. Some of these laboratories have got the potential to become referral laboratories for the industrial sector and government. Prior to being recognised by the government as a referral laboratory, testing parameters have to be accredited by National Accreditation Board for Testing and Calibration Laboratories (NABL) in compliance with ISO / IEC 17025:2017 (testing and calibration laboratories) and ISO 15189 (medical laboratories) standard. It is proposed to obtain accreditation for food testing laboratory and food microbiology laboratories as per ISO / IEC 17025:2017 then measures will be taken to obtain accreditation for medical parameters as per ISO 15189.

A prelude to be setting up to NABL accredited lab the university has strengthened the activities of CIMF and also the department of Food Science and Nutrition.

The Department of Food Science and Nutrition is an active participant in I-Stem Portal; 9 equipments are uploaded in the I-Stem portal. Two Facility Booking Record (FBR) is received (For RVA & Spray Dryer). RVA is under service, and the Spray Dryer based analysis is completed the report is submitted through i-STEM portal. With the increased activities we are

processing to obtain NABL accreditation for the Food Science and Nutrition lab.

5.3.6. Creation of Qualification Packs for Industry-Aligned Modules and Content Localisation

Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship is officiating many approved Qualification Packs as Industry aligned modules for skill—based training through various Sector Skill Councils of the National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC). Still, there are need and potential to create Qualification Packs for more job—specific skills as per local and regional industry requirements which could be validated and approved by the concerned Sector Skill Council of NSDC. Periyar University Jurisdiction based industry specific qualification packs in compliance with the National Skills Qualification Framework (NSQF) and National Credit Framework of the National Council for Vocational Education and Training (NCVET) will be framed in association with relevant industries and proposed for validation and approval by NSDC. In addition, unique industry—aligned module—based content will also be localised, copyrighted to Periyar University and published in the e—learning zone of the concerned Sector Skill Council or University e—learning zone for the benefit of students and the industrial sector.

In response to the Planning Board's recommendation for Periyar University to create industry-specific Qualification Packs (QPs) and obtain approval from relevant Sector Skill Councils, the following progress update is provided:

The recommendation to develop university-specific qualification packs aligned with local and regional industrial requirements, which would be validated and approved by the concerned Sector Skill Councils of NSDC, is currently pending implementation. While this primary objective remains to be addressed, the University has taken preliminary steps through awareness and capacity-building initiatives.

Specifically, the University organized two programs to build understanding and preparedness: a focused session for Heads of Departments on O1.12.2023, addressing the integration of NSDC Sector Skill Council modules into the university curriculum, followed by a comprehensive program for all university faculty members on O7.03.2024, regarding NSDC Sector Skill Councils' alignment with university syllabi. Consequently, a circular was issued on May 16, 2024, to all Board of Studies Chairmen regarding skill content integration.

The Planning Board's recommendation of developing and securing approval for industry—specific qualification packs will be completed before the end of this year.

5.3.7. Imparting Tech Skill through Industrial Partner

The academicians are not able to support students with the current requirements of industries and thus industries are struggling to train the recruited employees. Hence, we propose to establish a section 8 company with the infrastructure and man power support from industries and train the students for Industry 4.0 convergence by utilizing the "content localisation" created specifically for this purpose. The university will provide sufficient floor space for industries while the partnering industries should ensure the placement either in their own industries or in the needy industries (placement-linked skills)

We are providing employment to the students through the University Placement Cell. 




